Letters From Our Students

I am currently serving a 30 year term for armed robbery. During my incarceration I've done just about everything. I was a thrill seeker and drug abuser.

Before my incarceration, I was a gang banger from California and Washington state. I've experienced what most people only see in movies. I thought my life was normal. I thought that the things that ran through my head were normal. For the first time in my life, being in prison is where I felt normal.

Then one day I was out in the yard with a friend, and he introduced me to Jesus Christ. After that day, everything that felt normal was now awkward. I've made a few bad decisions since then, but nothing detrimental or anything. I still struggle with myself on a daily basis, but the difference is Jesus is with me, He is my hope. He is my focus. He is my joy. He is my future. He saved me, a heathen unworthy of anything. He flipped my world right side up.

I am now in my calling as a lead facilitator in Celebrate Recovery Inside, and also have a calling for seminary, but that day will come when God opens that door. I thank God for sending His Son for me.

I have been in church since my childhood on and off. Since my teenage years, I had really lost my faith though. I am 34 now. Well, since coming back to prison for my sixth time, I signed up for the P.A.L. program (a faith-based live-in one-year program) thinking it would look good when I go up in front of the parole board and they would approve my parole. I was going up within that month. Little did I know God had a different plan.

I told God, thinking He would see it my way, “God, just to let you know even if they give me parole denial I will finish this program, but please let me make it.” As you can see, I'm still here. What I didn't know was God knew I was wavering in my faith and made me eat my words. The parole board gave me a one-year denial.

And even though this might sound crazy, it was a blessing. I am now 2 months into the year, my faith is renewed, and I'm closer to God than have ever been. It's like the old country song says, some of God's greatest gifts are unanswered prayers. If I would have made parole, I'd been right back to my old ways. I thank God every day for this extra time with Him. It is just what I needed.

Letters from Our Students:

I was hooked on crystal meth and in a very abusive relationship. As I sat at my desk where I sold my drugs, I was watching my TV. It was on a Christian station and the man was asking if you feel trapped or alone and feel like there is no one you can talk to or have no options and feel like giving up. I felt all those things and said aloud with a laugh, "Mister you have no idea."

It was then that he informed me that he had an answer. I said aloud the short prayer accepting Jesus as my Lord and Savior. Nothing happened. So I said, "God I said the prayer, what's up? If you wanted me, then why didn't I feel something? I said 'I quit.' It's all on You. I can't do it." It was then I felt it. It was indescribable. I stared crying for what I don't know but it felt awesome. I started talking to God aloud and said fix me, change my path, I don't know how. Less than 30 hours later I was in handcuffs, charged with a list of felonies. I was looking at 16 years on one case and 4.5 and 10.25 years on the other three cases.

God took me out of the situation I was in. Not what I thought, but who am I to question God. Two cases were dropped and I pled to 6 years on the one case and 3.5 on the other. I served concurrent sentences and I now am clean and sober for 6 years and have a faith-based relationship with a woman who encourages me and we plan to be married upon my release in October 2017. Praise God for knowing what you need when you don't. Thank you for letting me tell my story. God bless. ■

We do not have to go anywhere but to Him in order for us to be useful in His Kingdom.


